We come together to...

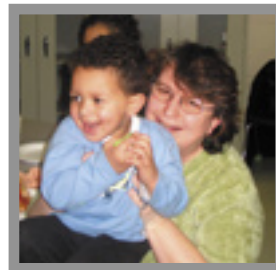
- share experiences
